Dr. David Williams is a Professor of Anesthesiology, Medicine (Rheumatology), Psychiatry, and Psychology at the University of Michigan where he also serves as the Associate Director of the Chronic Pain and Fatigue Research Center, Co-Director of Research Development within the Michigan Institute for Clinical and Health Research (MICHR/CTSA), and is a senior faculty member in the Institute of Healthcare Policy and Innovation. He received his doctorate from the Ohio State University and has previously held faculty appointments at both Duke and at Georgetown University Medical Centers. He is both a clinician and researcher with publications in the areas of chronic illness management, e- and m-health service delivery, patientreported outcomes instrument development and validation, and mechanisms of pain perception/modulation. Currently he is the President of the American Pain Society, serves on numerous scientific editorial boards, and participates on scientific review committees both nationally and internationally.
