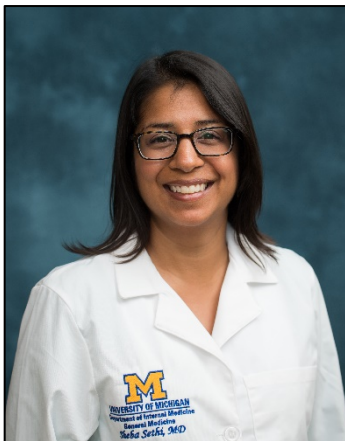
FACULTY
