Training Developed For Practice Teams Treating Pain And Addiction

Mi-CCSI, in collaboration with the University of Michigan's Chronic Pain and Fatigue Center and Michigan provider systems developed a comprehensive training program to address patients with acute and chronic pain. The focus of the training is centered on changing the way providers and staff diagnose and treat pain, emphasizing psychosocial and non-pharmaceutical interventions as well as introductions to weaning and addiction.

Morning - Foundations of Pain Management

The morning sessions will include a review of the pain management mechanisms, pathophysiology, biopsychosocial aspects, multi-disciplinary care team approaches, pharmacotherapy, non-pharmacy and cannabinoid treatment approaches, and open panel questions and discussion.

Afternoon - Workshops

Two afternoon workshop tracks are offered to further explore practical application.

Track One: Substance Use Disorders

- Review tapering approaches
- Discuss Crucial Conversations
- Case Study applications

Track Two: Team-Based Care For Chronic Pain

- Review assessment and care planning components
- Discuss ways to ways to optimize the multi-disciplinary team (Physical Therapy, Behavioral Health Services)
